Community Spay/Neuter Program (CSNiP) So How's It Going?

Roundup, MT, 31 March 2006 – At the beginning of 2006, the Rimrock Humane Society implemented a new community spay/neuter program called CSNiP. They completed a massive county wide mailing and are hopeful that most of you have received the CSNiP brochure and are now aware of this program's many benefits and far reaching goals.

"We are very pleased with the public's response to getting their animals altered through this new program", stated Rimrock's President, Sandy Church. "So far, there are sixty-six animals that have either been altered or have appointments for their surgeries. This after only three months into the program – it truly shows the need for this service here in the Roundup community."

The Rimrock Humane Society wanted to share with you, the public, the dollars available and the statistics of animals assisted so you can visualize better how successful this program has been as of this writing. Currently, the CSNiP bank account has a total of \$4,800 with over \$1,400 worth of surgeries pending payment to the local veterinarians. As of the end of February 2006, (7) dogs and (18) cats had been altered with the cost of those surgeries totaling \$900.

As you can see, the fund currently has a decent sized nest egg thanks to some very large general donations that came to the Rimrock Humane Society. The donors had several options as to where their money could be designated and happily, most of those funds ended up in the new and growing CSNiP fund. However, the humane society does want to point out that this program has a finite amount of money to spend if the donations do not keep coming through their doors. There have been many generous donations from the Roundup community and Rimrock deeply thanks those people for their sharing and caring. You can easily see by looking at the numbers above that there has been \$900 already paid out for surgeries and another \$1,400 pending payment and that is just for the first three months of this year! Also, just to highlight, for those who have had their animals altered through this program, your donations were greatly appreciated as this money helped defray the cost of the surgery but it does not, unfortunately, replenish the funds.
