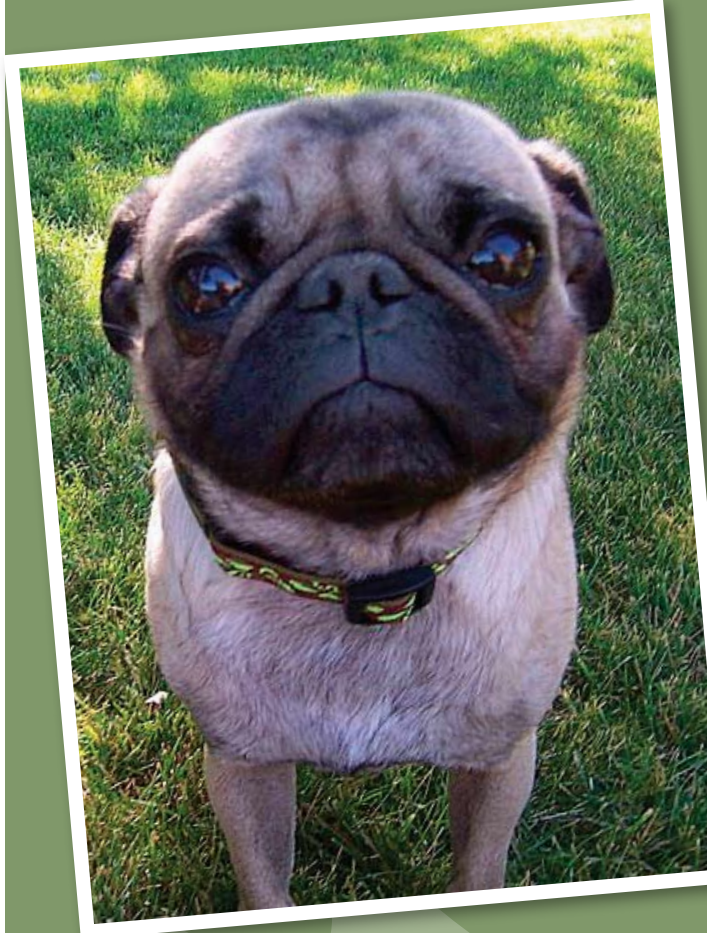

Make a Difference

Over 9 million animals are euthanized each year in the U.S. because there are not enough homes for them all. 56% of dogs and 71% of cats that enter shelters are put down primarily due to lack of shelter space. The numbers are mind boggling and many people feel overwhelmed not knowing how to best assist with this tragic situation.



Being a foster parent is like being a grandparent – all the enjoyment of caring for an animal without the lifetime responsibility. However, a foster parent must be the type of person who can take home a needy animal, care for it and then be able to let it go to another family.

We carefully match up foster dog/puppies and cats/kittens with foster parents based on what works for your household. We are devoted to finding the best possible match for each of our foster families whether you want to foster a small dog, kitten, an adult cat or large dog.

We will provide you a foster animal that best meets your criteria and environment. All animals will be veterinarian checked and current on vaccinations. The RHS will provide all food, medical expenses and litter. You will provide the love, shelter and, in some cases, training to assist that animal in becoming a terrific candidate for adoption. All dog foster homes must have a fenced yard and our cat foster homes must be indoor only.

Our foster parents are a critical piece of the rescue process and we are deeply indebted to them for their willingness to welcome new foster members into their lives and their homes.

There is a saying which states, "Nobody can do everything, but everyone can do something." Making a difference in even one animal's life is truly a gift to that animal.

By opening your home and your hearts, you are giving that pet a second chance at life – a new beginning of love, trust and companionship. That is our promise to our foster families; the knowledge that you can and will make a difference in the lives of these precious animals.
